Our Food Roots team swiftly met pandemic-related food security needs in low income communities of color. With the help of the HEAL and Tobacco teams, we distributed:



65,177 lbs of locally grown, culturally relevant produce

18,800 eggs to

27,593 people in low income, communities of color

and generated **\$121,195** of income for produce and egg farmers

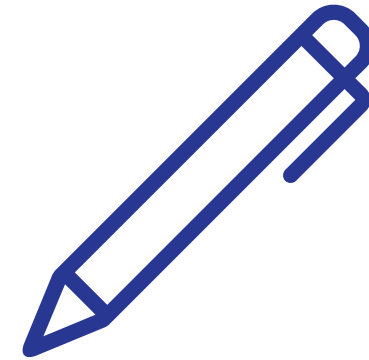

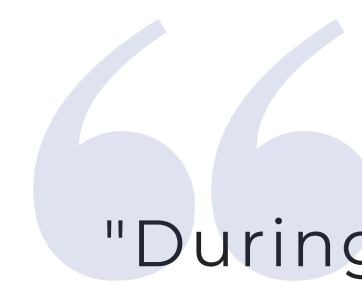
NATURE FOR ALL (N4A)

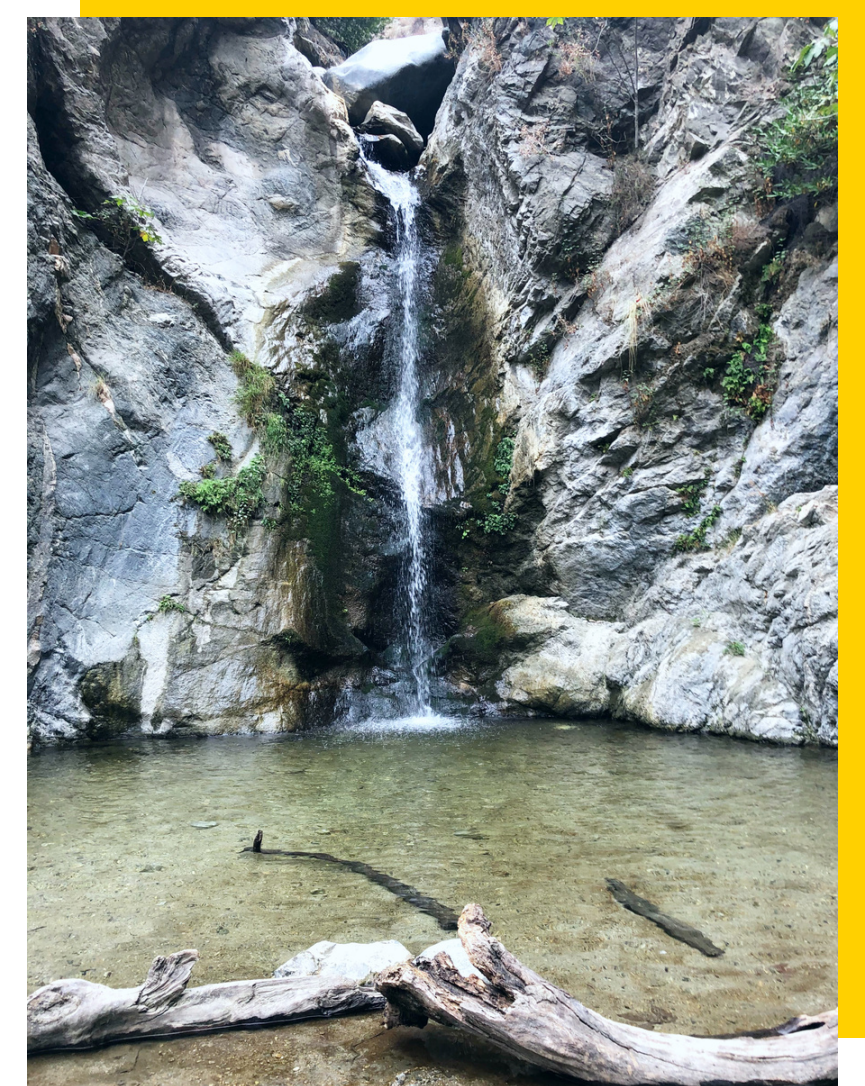
